- 1 You'll need a window box (or two if you've got space) with drainage holes.
- 2 Use peat-free compost in your window box.
- 3 Stock up on pollinator friendly plants that are suitable for window boxes. Choose from...

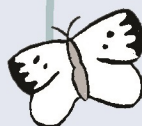
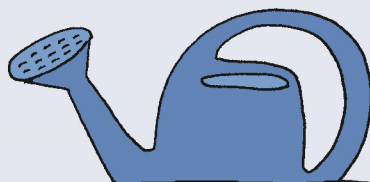

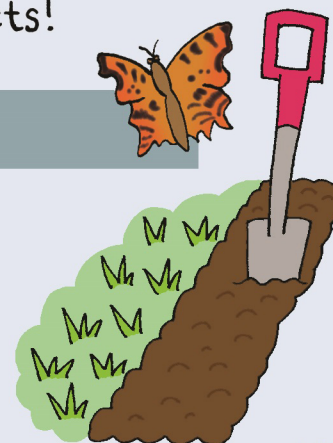

- 2 Dig up any old roots to prepare your border.
