## Terms and Conditions – Chess Valley Challenge 2020

As the United Kingdom continues to reopen in phases and in-person events resume, Herts and Middlesex Wildlife Trust are eager to start bringing people together again through live experiences.

After careful consideration and following current guidelines from the government, we have implemented the following measures to promote the health and wellbeing of attendees, staff and volunteers. As the situation evolves, so will our approach to keeping you safe. We thank you for your patience and flexibility as we manage this.

- **Participants must not attend if anyone in the group has experienced COVID-19 symptoms in the past 14 day, has been diagnosed with COVID-19 in the past 14-days, or has had contact with a known or suspected COVID-19 case.**
- **Participants must advise the Trust if they have had exposure to or diagnosis of COVID-19 within 14 days of attending the event.**
- **Social distancing of 2m required at all times between family groups of walkers.**
- **Hand sanitiser will be available for use at the beginning and end of the walk and it is recommended to bring own supply.**
- **Participants are recommended to wear a face covering while in proximity to other walkers.**
- **Participants must bring a face covering for use on public transport (train back to Rickmansworth) unless medically exempt.**
- **Participants must bring own first aid kit for minor injuries and they are recommended to carry a fully charged mobile phone.**
- **Full refund of registration fee given for cancellations up to 14 days before the event.**
- **Full refund of registration fee given if Rickmansworth, Chesham or surrounding area is subject to a local lockdown or attendees are coming from an area of local lockdown.**
- **No refund of donations raised for the Trust by participants or other donors.**
- **No refund of registration fee for non-attendance.**

We have followed the Government guidance to enable us to be 'COVID-19 Secure' and have undertaken a risk assessment to ensure we have both identified the necessary controls and put them in place, to protect our staff, volunteers and members of the public.
